

Competition	Aussie Pairs
Format	Mixed 4 Bowl Pairs League – On the first end the first players shall play two bowls each, second players then each play four bowls before the first players play two bowls each to complete the end. The second players will then start the next end.
Shots/Ends	Each match will consist of 14 ends or 2 hours 5 minutes whichever comes first. The bell will sound on 2 hours 5 minutes at which point the Jack must have been legally cast for an end to continue
Dress Code	White tops (or branded bowls tops) above the waist and Greys below.
Marker required	None required
Umpire	Any competent member of the club
Rink Choice	Rinks will be drawn by the league organiser
Toss for Jack	Away team calls, winner has choice of Jack on the first end
Trial ends	None
Dead end	A dead end will count as an end. The team that does not kill the end will receive two shots and have choice of the jack on the next end.
Tied end	Counts as an end and score marked as 0 for both teams
Visiting the head	No player can visit the head. Both first and both second players of each team must be at the same end
Leaving the green	No player shall leave the green without their opponents permission. The other team must record the time away on the scorecard. This will be added onto the time available if needed to ensure 14 ends are played. In the event the time away is more than 10 minutes the game shall be forfeited.
Slow play	As a timed game, play should continue in a timely manner. Possession of the rink rules shall be followed, so any player ready to bowl shall not be impeded by any opposing player.
Scorecard	Signed by both skips and handed to tournament organiser or posted in the Aussie Pairs Box.

Recording of result	Tournament organiser will record the scores, 2 points for a win and 1 point for a draw. League winners will be decided on: points, then highest shot difference, then number of ends won
